

"The world locked down and closed in. We were torn apart from one another.


At the same time, we were dealing with other deeply personal challenges. A long past due reckoning with race in America.



INSTRUCTION AT SDSU LIBRARY

- We're a CSU with a Teaching & Learning Mission
 - But a pressure of becoming a R1
- Instruction Dynamics
 - Plenty of Opportunity not just
 Public Service Librarians
 - No shared learning outcomes, organization, or training
 - Academic freedom taken to the extreme of territory, secretiveness, insular
- Hot Potato of General Instruction
 - July 2021 Jenny took over
