<b>Universal Design for Learning</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Multiple entry points to content</li> <li>• Multiple ways of knowing, thinking, and building knowledge</li> <li>• Multiple ways of demonstrating mastery</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Allow students the options to either watch a video or listen to a podcast for the same content</li> <li>• Let students either write an essay or give a presentation to show mastery</li> </ul>	
<b>Culturally Responsive Teaching</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Incorporate cultural references into learning materials</li> <li>• Utilize cultural means of instruction</li> <li>• Pay attention to communication patterns &amp; language use</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use readings or articles produced by diverse scholars</li> <li>• Where relevant, include various sources of media like memes or TikTok</li> <li>• Have students share an interesting fact about themselves</li> </ul>	
<b>Andragogy</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recognize students lived experiences as assets in teaching</li> <li>• Utilize immediate ways to use new knowledge</li> <li>• Situate importance of material to be taught</li> <li>• Recognize student autonomy and agency in what/how they learn</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Learn about students' past and interests (build rapport)</li> <li>• Emphasize students' identities as scholars with authority</li> <li>• Tailor assignments to students' career goals</li> </ul>
